Luncheon Presentation, August 12, 2023



Her book, "Fractured not Broken," is the true story of loss, faith, and a rare love that only happens in nonfiction. The Amazon Bestseller has won the New Apple Spirit Award and the Inspirational Award, and Schaefer's story has been featured on ESPN and in *Rosie* magazine. She will have copies of her book available for sale at the convention.

In 1998, Schaefer – then a cheerleader for the Indiana University Hoosiers – won national cheerleading awards. However, her life took a tragic turn when a drunk driver left her quadriplegic in 1999.

Schaefer lost her athletic ability, but not her spirit, and she has since traveled to hundreds of Midwest schools to share her story, demonstrating how the human spirit, combined with personal faith and

the support of loved ones, can overcome challenges and enable others to succeed beyond their wildest imagination.

Schaefer says she feels blessed that her story can inspire others.

Hello fellow Optimist,

As we enter the fourth quarter of this Optimist year, our membership is sitting at a net -2,000, right where it has been the last few years.

But why should you care about the membership in Optimist International? You joined your local club to look after the needs of the children in your community. Not Optimist International.

So why should you care? In order for Optimist International to be down in membership, it means that clubs just like yours, and maybe even your own club, are not replacing the members they are losing. That is putting a heavier burden on the members remaining in the club but also decreasing the resources we have in our clubs to address the needs of the children in our communities. If we continue along this trajectory, in 10 to 15 years, Optimist International will not have enough clubs or members to be able to sustain an international headquarters.

What would that mean to you as an Optimist in your local club?

- 1. No umbrella liability insurance coverage every club would have to find their own liability coverage
- 2. No Foundations meaning no scholarship programs or grants for clubs
- 3. No website or Optimist Institute no training or information to support members and club executives
- 4. No support structure no zones, no districts, no trained leaders to help your clubs
- 5. No conventions or zone meetings no opportunities to meet other Optimists and share ideas
- 6. No community recognition of the name, Optimist International

Although you joined your local clubs to assist the youth in your community, the decline of Optimist International will have an impact on you, your club and your community.

But it doesn't have to be this way. Just think, if every club, ON AVERAGE, was net +1 in membership over the next three months, we would be close to breaking even with our overall net membership for Optimist International.

If strengthening your club to protect the Optimist legacy in your community and continue to help the children in your community is not motivation enough, Optimist International is offering a 4th quarter membership incentive that should be exciting for all clubs. No matter the size of your club, you will have an opportunity to win significant cash prizes that you will be able to put towards your club projects. There will be awards for the top 3 clubs in two categories. The total number of new members added and the highest percentage of new members added. \$1,000 for 1st place, \$750 for 2nd place and \$500 for 3rd place. And for all of the clubs that do not make it to be one of the top three, there will be two additional, random draws of \$300 from all of the clubs that registered to be part of this program AND added at least one member during the 4th quarter. Correction of June "Just 3 Things". The top three clubs in each category in all of Optimist International (NOT IN EACH DISTRICT – as stated in my June message) will get the monetary awards.

But there are parameters around this program. In order to participate:

- Clubs must proactively "opt-in" to be part of the program click here to access the form.
- Clubs in the running for prizes must have their 1st quarter dues payment, including all of the new members added, paid to Optimist International by October 31st.
- Clubs must also maintain and pay for these members through the 2nd quarter of the 2023-24 Optimist year.
- We will track all new members added during the 4th quarter in each club and you will get updates in my monthly emails and other head office communications.
- Finalist clubs will be announced the beginning of November.
- Payment of prize money will be sent to clubs in February 2024.

We need you to be adding members, not numbers. People committed to the mission of our great organization, people just like you!

Let's work together to strengthen our clubs to ensure continued service to the youth in our communities for decades to come. If each of us focused on our own club, the accumulated growth in all of our clubs would result in overall growth and strengthening of our organization.

Thank you for being Optimists and thank you for making a positive difference in the lives of the children in your community. Let's work together to ensure we are here for decades to come.



Why did YOU decide to get involved? What is your Club doing that keeps you coming back? Have you invited someone to a Club event so they can find their own reason to get involved?

The youth in our communities need us more today than ever before! If you have any doubt about that, reach out to your local elementary school and ask about the number of students that attend school without the proper nutrition, supplies or winter clothing. Just imagine the difference we could make by supporting those students to be their best, setting the very foundation for their entire future!

As we continue to shrink in membership, so does our support and service to the youth in our communities. In the end, it is the children that are suffering from our inability (or unwillingness?) to *just invite* someone to share our love and passion for our organization.

Fellow Optimists, everything that happens in our organization happens at the Club level, through you, our Members. All we can do as your international leaders is provide you with information, motivation and, sometimes, a little incentive.

To that end, the Membership Committee has come up with a new incentive for the third quarter: "Lighting the Fuse on Your Optimist Rocket."

A New Member Incentive





The Optimist Club of the Year is the highest achievement an Optimist Club can attain in the Optimist organization. The recipient of this prestigious award will be chosen regardless of number of members, or region and will be known as the "Best Overall Club" in Optimist International.

The Optimist Club of the year award is presented annually to the most outstanding Club in the organization based on the following criteria:



	Maximum Points
Service projects sponsored by the Club	30 points
Member Development Programs a year (i.e. PGI Program, Optimist International Conventions and Summit, etc.)	25 points
Club Growth and Increased Community Awareness Campaigns (i.e. NOW Program, Marketing Campaign, etc.)	25 points
Increased Volunteer Member Base	10 points
New Community Efforts	10 points

Points in each category will be awarded by independent judges based upon community outreach, impact on children and Members, new and innovative ideas; and benefits to the individual Club Members.

Interested Clubs are invited to submit information as outlined on the <u>judging form</u>. Clubs can submit any materials they chose as the items relate to the specified criteria.
