


Below is a picture from last year's CCDHH contest held in May. It's time for every club in our District to find entrants for this year's contest. The winner receives a \$2500 Scholarship.

# Make Valuable Changes with Bylaws Proposals

Please take time to evaluate the **Optimist International Bylaws** to ensure they continue to effectively serve the organization. This process allows you and your Club to shape and improve all of Optimist International.

To recommend a revision, your Club must submit a proposed amendment citing the article(s) and section(s) and exact proposed change to the articles and sections cited, along with a written rationale in 200 words or fewer. The Club must submit the proposal on Club letterhead signed by the Club President. The proposal may be emailed to the International Office at <u>executiveoffice@optimist.org</u>, but the original Club letter must be received by the International Office for the proposal to be considered.

All submitted changes will be brought before the International Convention delegates for a vote.

All proposed change submissions to the Bylaws must be received at the International Office by 5:00 p.m. (CT) Wednesday, April 2, 2025 (no exceptions). Please submit to: Governance Committee, Optimist International, 4494 Lindell Blvd., St. Louis, MO 63108 or email to <u>executiveoffice@optimist.org</u>.

# Optimist Clubs Speak Through the Convention Resolutions Process

The Convention Resolution Process is a communications vehicle that can be used to your advantage. Resolutions can be submitted by clubs and should cover any aspect of the organization not already covered in the Bylaws.

# **The Resolutions Process**

- 1. Clubs need to submit resolutions by Friday, May 2, 2025, to the Governance/Resolutions Committee.
- 2. The Governance/Resolutions Committee will meet during the convention and choose the strongest resolutions to report to convention delegates.
- 3. At the convention business session July 2, 2025, the Committee will present these resolutions for debate and vote by the convention delegates. (NOTE: *Resolutions endorsed by convention delegates are non-binding and are sent to the International Board of Directors for further consideration and study.*)

## How to Submit Resolutions

Type resolutions on club stationery and include the Club's name, number, and president's signature. All resolutions should be written in standard resolution format: Whereas ..., Whereas ..., Whereas ..., Be it resolved that the Board of Directors of Optimist International is asked to consider ....

We are excited to tell you about how New Members will be handled going forward.

We are aware that there has been disappointment over the fact that the paper New Member Kits stopped being mailed out around the 2020-21 year, and it has been difficult to find the best way to distribute New Member pins to Clubs, so we decided to try something different.

When a New Member is added, they are automatically emailed a "Welcome New Member Magazine". The Optimist International Presidential New Member Letter is in this magazine along with information about opportunities that a new member might be interested in.

An email will be generated that will be sent to the Club President and the Club Secretary that will have the following attachments with it: A Creed, the Purposes, our Core Value Statement and Member Certificate. These have all been sized to be printed on an 8.5 x 11 piece of certificate paper and the Member Certificate will have the New Members Name on it.

Each Club will be able to order New Member pins from Optimist International. An order form is available at this link.

The number of pins you receive will be based on the number of new members that your Club has brought in over the past two years. You can order more as you need them at no cost to the Club.

The New Member pins have been slow to come in, so while you are welcome to place your order, please be advised that it may be a few weeks before we can get those to you

Sponsor recognition pins will continue to be mailed from Optimist International.

As with all new processes, there will be "kinks" to work out so please have patience, but we are looking forward to this new process and hope that you are too!

# New Personal Growth and Involvement Plan (PGI) Guidelines

A webinar was held to introduce the new Personal Growth and Involvement Plan (PGI) for Optimist International. Below are the new program guidelines, as well as the <u>list of the requirements</u> for each level.

Please note that all levels of the new PGI must be completed on the Optimist Institute. If you have been working on PGI levels in the last 5 years, take special note of #3 below.

New PGI Guidelines:

- 1. The new PGI program will be available online in the Optimist Institute on September 10, 2024.
- 2. To participate in the PGI program, each member is required to have an active account in the Optimist Institute.
- 3. Any current member that has completed PGI Level 3 or higher within the last 5 years will be able to start at the next level they need to complete. For those members, previous levels will be unlocked, and members have the option to complete earlier levels in part or in their entirety as desired. All other members will begin work at Level 1. Members receiving manual credit must be sure their account has been created in the Optimist Institute on or before October 31, 2024, and credit will be granted by November 30, 2024. If an account has not been created, credit for the completed levels cannot be granted. Those who fail to have an account by October 31, 2024, will start over at Level 1 in the program (if you have created an account in the past, you are all set just be sure it's been renewed for this year!).
- 4. The levels of PGI must be completed consecutively. Upon successful completion of a level, the next level will be unlocked, as some of the work builds up to other work.
- 5. When completing components within each level, members must be sure to follow the verification deadlines as required for each submission, which will always be within 60 days. However,

members can take as long as they want/need to complete an entire level.

- 6. Certificates of completion for each PGI level can be generated through the Optimist Institute once a level is completed. Reward badges for each level will also be awarded through the Optimist Institute.
- 7. The Level 10 gold pinback will be sent directly to the District PGI Chair or Governor for presentation to the member, unless the OI office is informed that it should be sent to the member directly.
- 8. The PGI Passport, along with other forms of written documentation and verification, will no longer be accepted.

As a note, please know that the PDP will be receiving a rewrite by the Optimist International Leadership Development Committee during the 2024-2025 year, as they have been charged with this task. Because of this, the current PDP was taken offline on Sept. 10, 2024.

When it is finished, it will be relaunched on the Optimist Institute, and a webinar will be held to explain the differences between the old and new programs – just as is being done with the PGI.

Optimist International sponsors three scholarship contests for students to earn money to pursue opportunities in higher education: The Communication Contest for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing (CCDHH), the Essay Contest and the Oratorical Contest. The contests are conducted at the Club level, then Zone and Regional (if necessary) and at the District level. District-level scholarships are funded by the Optimist International Foundations and awarded by Optimist International.





#### **ORATORICAL CONTEST**

Beginning in 1928, the Oratorical Contest has become the longest-running program of Optimist international. The contest is designed for young people to gain experience in public speaking and provide them with an opportunity to compete for multiple college acholarships with a pre-assigned topic.

# **OI Foundation**

Dime-A-Day Level is reached by a contribution of \$36.50 to the Foundation within one Optimist Year and is recognized by the presentation of a pin.



The Diamond Level requires a minimum donation to the Foundation of \$100 annually and the donor receives a specially designed postcard and thank you message from the Foundation President.

Women's Philanthropy Council (WPC) was formed in 2005 to support the work of the Optimist International Foundation. Members reach out to women as donors and assist in shaping their philanthropy. All donations raised through the giving circle of the WPC will be used to underwrite World Oratorical Championship scholarships for young women that win the Regional Contest from the US and in the Caribbean. It is important to note that your contribution to OIF designated to support the efforts of the WPC will be counted as a restricted donation and will not be credited to your annual giving or that of your District/Club.
