


### **Santa Claus Scholarships**



### Optimist Junior Golf Tournament held June 25th at Hulman Links

Thirty junior golfers representing fourteen different high schools and their feeder middle schools registered to play in the 2025 Optimist Terre Haute Regional on June 25<sup>th</sup> at Hulman Links.

On a broiling hot day that featured very little wind, 99'F temperatures and a 50-minute weather delay due to lightning, the players aged 10-18 competed in 6 of the 7 available age groups.

All entries into the tournament receive a discount on the entry fee for the 2026 Optimist Indiana South District Tournament in June 2026.

Playing from 6,250 yards, the Boys 16-18 group saw Northview teammates Lincoln Pierce and Aydan Green battling until the final hole as Pierce rallied on the 18<sup>th</sup> hole to claim a three-shot victory.

Pierce put up an impressive 72 while Green shot a 75. Third place was won by Terre Haute North's Noah Walker who scored a 77.

All three of these players are veterans of this tournament and have played in it each year since it restarted after Covid-19 in 2021. Other participants included Carter Johnson and Morgan Horst of Vincennes, Zane Paddock of Clay City, Mohammad Shehadeh of Evansville, and Trenton Woelfle of Terre Haute North.

In the Boys 14-15 Age Group playing from 5800 yards, Gavin Acord from Terre Haute South shot an outstanding 37 on the front nine to build a six-shot lead and went on to win by 8 over a large and very competitive field.

In second place was Cooper Goda from Life Academy with an 88 followed by Bronx Meyer of Terre Haute South who shot an 89. There were 9 other players in the group who shot scores ranging from 90-103. Included in the field were Drew Williams, Lucas McNeely, Tucker Goda and Hayden Fisher from North Clay MS/Northview, Dayton Lindsay from West Vigo, Ryan Grassick from Terre Haute North, Lucas Downing of Greencastle, Lane Williams from Cloverdale, and Liam Busenbark from Parke Heritage.

The Boys 12-13 and 11-12 groups only had a single competitor each but they both put up impressive scores for 9 holes in an event shortened due to the extreme heat.

Cash Ferguson from Plainfield claimed the B12-13 age group shooting a 39 from the black tees set at an 18-hole distance of 4100 yards. His playing partner Boyd Landis of Sullivan shot an equally impressive 46 from the same tees.

The field on the girls' side was smaller. Mia Tribble from Northview claimed first place in the Girls 15-18 group followed by Breeann Desmith of Parke Heritage in second. In the Girls 13-14 group, MacKenzie Horn from North Clay Middle School won first place outshooting Kennedy Hackert from Honey Creek Middle School.





Dear Club Presidents & Club Secretaries,

We are excited to tell you about how New Members will be handled going forward.

We are aware that there has been disappointment over the fact that the paper New Member Kits stopped being mailed out around the 2020-21 year, and it has been difficult to find the best way to distribute New Member pins to Clubs, so we decided to try something different.

When a New Member is added, they are automatically emailed a "Welcome New Member Magazine". The Optimist International Presidential New Member Letter is in this magazine along with information about opportunities that a new member might be interested in.

An email will be generated that will be sent to the Club President and the Club Secretary that will have the following attachments with it: A Creed, the Purposes, our Core Value Statement and Member Certificate. These have all been sized to be printed on an 8.5 x 11 piece of certificate paper and the Member Certificate will have the New Members Name on it.

Each Club will be able to order New Member pins from Optimist International. An order form is available at this link.

The number of pins you receive will be based on the number of new members that your Club has brought in over the past two years. You can order more as you need them at no cost to the Club.

The New Member pins have been slow to come in, so while you are welcome to place your order, please be advised that it may be a few weeks before we can get those to you

Sponsor recognition pins will continue to be mailed from Optimist International.

As with all new processes, there will be "kinks" to work out so please have patience, but we are looking forward to this new process and hope that you are too!

# New Personal Growth and Involvement Plan (PGI) Guidelines

A webinar was held to introduce the new Personal Growth and Involvement Plan (PGI) for Optimist International. Below are the new program guidelines, as well as the <u>list of the requirements</u> for each level.

Please note that all levels of the new PGI must be completed on the Optimist Institute. If you have been working on PGI levels in the last 5 years, take special note of #3 below.

#### New PGI Guidelines:

- 1. The new PGI program will be available online in the Optimist Institute on September 10, 2024.
- 2. To participate in the PGI program, each member is required to have an active account in the Optimist Institute.
- 3. Any current member that has completed PGI Level 3 or higher within the last 5 years will be able to start at the next level they need to complete. For those members, previous levels will be unlocked, and members have the option to complete earlier levels in part or in their entirety as desired. All other members will begin work at Level 1. Members receiving manual credit must be sure their account has been created in the Optimist Institute on or before **October 31, 2024**, and credit will be granted by November 30, 2024. If an account has not been created, credit for the completed levels cannot be granted. Those who fail to have an account by October 31, 2024, will start over at Level 1 in the program (if you have created an account in the past, you are all set just be sure it's been renewed for this year!).
- 4. The levels of PGI must be completed consecutively. Upon successful completion of a level, the next level will be unlocked, as some of the work builds up to other work.
- 5. When completing components within each level, members must be sure to follow the verification deadlines as required for each submission, which will always be within 60 days. However,

- members can take as long as they want/need to complete an entire level.
- 6. Certificates of completion for each PGI level can be generated through the Optimist Institute once a level is completed. Reward badges for each level will also be awarded through the Optimist Institute.
- 7. The Level 10 gold pinback will be sent directly to the District PGI Chair or Governor for presentation to the member, unless the OI office is informed that it should be sent to the member directly.
- 8. The PGI Passport, along with other forms of written documentation and verification, will no longer be accepted.

As a note, please know that the PDP will be receiving a rewrite by the Optimist International Leadership Development Committee during the 2024-2025 year, as they have been charged with this task. Because of this, the current PDP was taken offline on Sept. 10, 2024.

When it is finished, it will be relaunched on the Optimist Institute, and a webinar will be held to explain the differences between the old and new programs – just as is being done with the PGI.

Optimist International sponsors three scholarship contests for students to earn money to pursue opportunities in higher education: The Communication Contest for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing (CCDHH), the Essay Contest and the Oratorical Contest. The contests are conducted at the Club level, then Zone and Regional (if necessary) and at the District level. District-level scholarships are funded by the Optimist International Foundations and awarded by Optimist International.




#### **ESSAY CONTEST**

# **OI Foundation**

Dime-A-Day Level is reached by a contribution of \$36.50 to the Foundation within one Optimist Year and is recognized by the presentation of a pin.

The Diamond Level requires a minimum donation to the Foundation of \$100 annually and the donor receives a specially designed postcard and thank you message from the Foundation President.

Women's Philanthropy Council (WPC) was formed in 2005 to support the work of the Optimist International Foundation. Members reach out to women as donors and assist in shaping their philanthropy. All donations raised through the giving circle of the WPC will be used to underwrite World Oratorical Championship scholarships for young women that win the Regional Contest from the US and in the Caribbean. It is important to note that your contribution to OIF designated to support the efforts of the WPC will be counted as a restricted donation and will not be credited to your annual giving or that of your District/Club. It will count towards lifetime giving.

Join the Presidents Club by making an initial unrestricted gift of \$250, and renew your membrship each year by making an annual \$250 contribution. When you join, you will receive a prestigious Presidents Club lapel pin. Each year at the International Convention, you will be recognized with a ribbon for your badge and will be invited to attend a function exclusively for members.



Friends of Today make a minimum unrestricted donation of \$500 annually to the Foundation. Donors will receive a special plaque designed by a local St. Louis artist.

The Christian D. Larson Partners was adopted to recognize donors who contribue a one-time \$1,000 unrestricted gift. \*Donors may combine multiple unrestricted gifts in one Optimist fiscal year to achieve the \$1,000 level. Partners will receive a plaque presented by the DFR.

To become a member of the William H. Harrison Society, donors must have a life-to-date of \$10,000 and contribute \$1,000 annually to the Foundation. Members will be invited to attend a recognition dinner with the Foundations' Boards of Directors at the International Convention. Members also receive a ribbon noting their Membership in Society to be worn with Convention badge.

#### OPTIMIST INTERNATIONAL FOUNDATION

The Optimist International Foundation was established on February 28, 1971.

The creators envisioned a Foundation that could provide significant funding for OI's youth and service programs and which would be proudly supported by individual Optimists, their Clubs, and the community at large.
